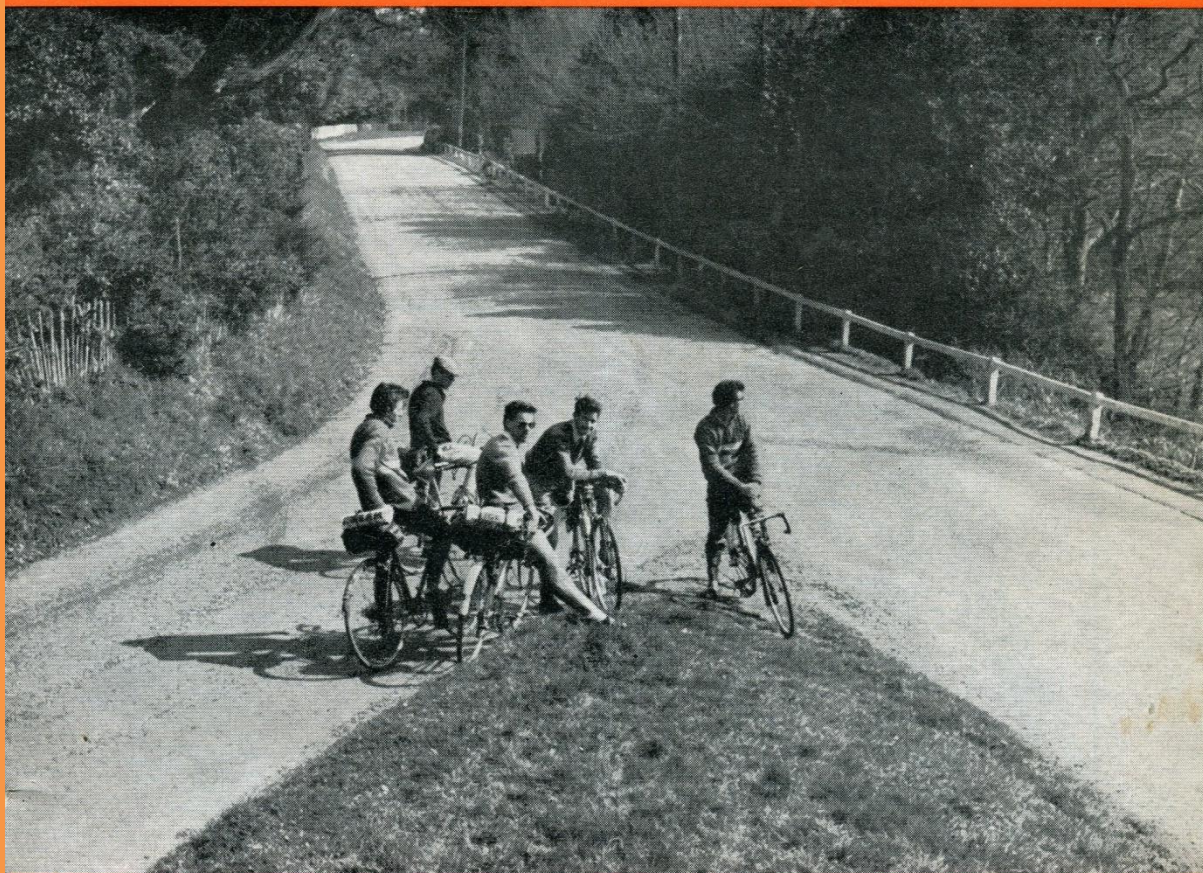

Countrywide elections for the new-look Council

THE rearrangement of CTC electoral Divisions, and the impending change to a new-style 'executive' Council of 15 members, has awakened fresh interest in the Club's administration.
