BIRTHDAY RIDES 1990.

By now most of you will be aware that the birthday rides are this year being organised by our D.A. To be held 4th - 11th August, at Moulton College, just North of Northampton. For those of you who are in the dark as to what the Birthday Rides are all about. here is a brief description.

Each year during the week which surrounds the anniversary of formation of the CTC a series of rides and social events is organized in a different location every year. Last year was at Monmouth and next year will be at Hereford. There are usually between 800 and 1000 cyclists attend the rides, so as you can imagine it is quite a Mammoth task to organise. We would like to see as many of you as possible at the rides. To obtain further information, simply use the form in "Cycletouring and Campaigning" Feb and March edition.

There will be rides to suit all abilities, from 30 miles to miles and lots in between. Each evening there are at least two social events, including barn dances, slide shows, bring and buy sales, a formal dinner at the Derngate and live bands. There will be a campsite nearby and rooms will be available at the college. But remember you must book early to avoid disappointment.

If you would like to help with the running of the Birthday rides, even if only for one evening, please contact Paul Bass (address on page one) who will be glad to hear from you. There are plenty of jobs to do, for example: Leading rides, marshalling, collecting tickets, setting up the campsite, making the tea (200 gallon teapot!), etc. etc. If you contact Paul very soon you may be able to choose which job you do. Unfortunately because of insurance we cannot waive the £5.00 event registration fee for people who help out. This is not to say that you must pay just to help, you can help as much as you like for free! However as soon as you actually go on a ride (this includes leading) or attend a social event then you must register.
